# HOW TO BE FRIENDLY TO CHURCH GUESTS (adapted from Thom Rainer)

- 1. Talk to someone you don't know. Resist talking to the same people each week and look for someone new to greet. That person might be a visitor or someone you haven't spoken to in church before.
- 2. People who are new to church don't know where to find things. Offer to show a guest where a bathroom is located rather than pointing the way. Do we have good signs in our church for directions?
- 3. Insider language can be a barrier for someone who hasn't heard it before. What words or phrases might you explain to a guest before worship starts to help them understand the service?
- 4. Take time to not only greet parents, but children as well. Remember if a child isn't happy or feeling welcome the parents won't be happy either.
- 5. The best way to be friendly in church is to be friendly outside of church. How can someone feel welcomed in church if you don't smile, show compassion and greet them on other days of the week as well? Take time every day to welcome another person and show them how you live out your faith in your daily life.

These cities have been seared into our brains due to the intolerance and fear of one human for another. And, predictably, humans have reacted with fear, hate and misunderstanding. Calls go out for legal solutions and an end to violence but we have yet to address the root of the discord.

The Coastal Plains Area-CCSW Reconciliation Ministry team invited youth to imagine a world without hatred, bigotry or racism. The Disciples in the C.P.A. have been on an intentional journey over the last year to be in meaningful, honest dialogue about the issue of racism and how we, as church, respond.
