GENERAL BOARD VOTES TO FORWARD REV. TERESA HORD OWENS TO GENERAL ASSEMBLY AS THE NOMINEE FOR GENERAL MINISTER AND PRESIDENT OF THE CHRISTIAN CHURCH (DISCIPLES OF CHRIST)



The Search Committee for the General Church had more than 40 people recommended last summer, nine of them were screened in accordance with the search process and four were interviewed in person. Rev. Hord Owens has been recommended to the General Board and they have voted to forward her as the nominee for GMP of the Christian Church (DoC). What they saw in her was that unique combination of pastoral leadership, active presence in all expressions of the church and administrative experience that was needed.

Hord Owens has been a Disciple since young adulthood. Currently, she serves as Dean of Students at the University of Chicago Divinity School and pastor at FCC (DoC) of Downers Grove, IL. Her ministry and intellectual interests include a theology of reconciliation, cultural intelligence, developing inclusive and multcultural congregations and the mentoring of youth and young adults. She is married to Walters Owens, Jr. with whom she will soon celebrate 30years of marriage and they are proud parents of an adult son.

Here are a few interesting things about Rev. Hord Owens. Her favorite Bible verses are John 17: 23 and Micah 6:8. The person who influenced her most in her faith life was her grandfather, Rev. Noel Hord who was a leader and shaper of young adults where she grew up in Terre Haute, IN. The part of her ministry that brings her the most joy is to "be and share the Good News" through the church's commitment to living into Christian unity. If elected, she will be the first African-American woman to lead a mainline denomination in the United States. Music is a big part of her life, she sings in her church choir, her husband is a choir director and her son is a music producer. Her favorite hymn is "Great is Thy Faithfulness" which reminds her that God's mercies are new every morning and God's provisions for her and the church is always refreshing and constant.
