The folding of the Flag of the United States of American and its presentation to the family of one who has served in the military is an impressive and moving ceremony. In observance of Veterans Day, I would like to share the following:

# SYMBOLISM OF THE FOLDING OF THE AMERICAN FLAG

**The First Fold** of our flag is the symbol of life.

The Second Fold is a symbol of our belief in eternal life.

<u>The Third Fold</u> is made in honor and remembrance of the Veteran departing our ranks who gave a portion of life for the defense of our country to attain peace throughout the world.

<u>The Fourth Fold</u> represents our weaker nature: as American citizens trusting in God, it is to Him we turn in times of peace as well as in times of war for His Divine guidance.

<u>The Fifth Fold</u> is a tribute to our country, for in the words of Stephen Decatur, "Our country is dealing with other countries; may She always be right: but it is still our country, right or wrong".

<u>The Sixth Fold</u> is for where our hearts lie. It is with our heart that we pledge allegiance to the flag of the United States of America and to the Republic for which it stands; one nation under God, indivisible, with liberty and justice for all.

**The Seventh Fold** is a tribute to our armed forces, for it is through the armed forces that we protect our country and our flag against all Her enemies whether they are found within or outside the boundaries of our republic.

<u>The Eighth Fold</u> is a tribute to the one who entered into the valley of the shadow of death that we may see the light of day.

<u>The Ninth Fold</u> is a tribute to womanhood; for it has been through their faith, love, loyalty, and devotion that the character of the men and women who have made this country great have been molded; and to honor the mother for whom it flies on Mother's day.

**The Tenth Fold** is a tribute to the father; for he too has given his sons and daughters for the defense of our country since they were first born.

<u>The Eleventh Fold</u> in the eyes of a Hebrew citizen, represents the lower portion of the seal of King David and King Solomon, and glorifies in their eyes the God of Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob.

<u>The Twelfth Fold</u> in the eyes of a Christian citizen represents an emblem of eternity and glorifies in their eyes God the Father, the Son, and the Holy Ghost.

When the Flag is Completely Folded, the stars are uppermost, reminding us of our national motto "In God we trust", after the flag is completely folded and tucked in, it takes on the appearance
