

Movie nights, Paintball nights and Mission Trips.


# BARBIE'S BOUTIQUE WILL BE OPEN

# The Real Story of Valentine's Day

Valentine's Day is about flowers, candy, red hearts, and romance, right?

The origin of this 'express your love' holiday isn't romantic. "The real story of the man behind the holiday – St. Valentine's Day, as related by Father Frank O'Gara of Whitefriars Street Church in Dublin, England, defiled the edict of his emperor, Claudius". That edict prohibited young people to marry, based on the hypothesis that unmarried soldiers were better warriors. During this time, society was very permissive, polygamy was accepted, even encouraged. This was a problem for those who chose Jesus, worshiped in the Christian church, and considered marriage a very sacred act between one man and one woman.

Father Valentine disagreed with Claudius; he encouraged young people to marry within the Christian Church, and he performed secret marriage ceremonies. Legend has it that this priest was caught, imprisoned and tortured for doing weddings, all because he countermanded the emperor. Legend says one of his judges was a man named Asterius, whose young daughter was blind. Valentine prayed with and healed the child with such astonishing effect that Asterius believed and became a Christian.

"In 69 AD, Father Valentine was sentenced to a three part execution; beating, stoning, and finally decapitation for his stand for Christian marriage". Again legend says, Valentine's last words were in a note to Asterius's daughter, signed "from your Valentine". These are the words of today's Valentine Day's romantic messages sent to loved ones. Father Valentine is the patron saint of lovers.

In every life, there comes a time when you have to lay your life upon the line for what you believe. Through Jesus and with the Holy Spirit, we can do just that. Before you enter into a Christian marriage, you want some

sense of God in your life, a knowledge that in Him, all things are possible. If Father Valentine were here today, he might say to the married couple, that suffering is a part of their life together. It's not easy to maintain your commitment and your vows in today's world. It takes dedicated work to maintain your gushing love as you mature into everlasting love.

Celebrate Valentine's Day – **First**, by loving God with all your heart, mind, and soul, then others, as He has loved you. **Second**, be His valentine and love Him back by loving those whom He has given you – your spouse, children, and extended family. Be their Valentine because of God's love for you. **Third**, by attending church, our meeting place for those of us who love God. Give, work; be a Valentine to your spiritual family. Then, **fourth**, be a Valentine to our community, outside our church walls. Pay attention...get involved where you can, make a difference in Jesus' name. **Finally**, SMILE! You make the world a better place.
