

LENT 2019

This Lenten Season finds your pastoral leadership in Louisiana, fulfilling a promise made a year ago. Our mission was to care for our son's aged dog, Trixie, as our son and daughter-in-law travel to celebrate their 30th



year wedding anniversary with 30 days in Australia, and so it is. All's well here, but we do miss you all. Even so, we all continue to celebrate the 40 days of Lent.

Our theme is "Walking with Jesus".
