

Did you know...

The songs 'All the Way My Savior

Leads Me', 'Blessed Assurance', 'He Hideth My Soul', 'I Am Thine, O Lord', 'Rescue the Perishing'. 'Redeemed, How I Love to Proclaim It', 'To God Be the Glory', 'Near the Cross', 'Pass Me Not, O Gentle Savior', and 'Praise Him, Praise Him' are just a few of the classics written by Fannie J. Crosby (1820-1915). Fannie was blinded at six weeks of age after developing a cold. Mustard poultices were applied to her eyes as a result. She always felt that this was the cause of her blindness, but she was never bitter. She felt that this made her depend even more upon the Lord. "She began to write verse at the age of eight and became known as the 'Queen of Gospel Song Writers'. She was one of the most prolific hymnists in history, writing more than 8,000 hymns and gospel songs, with more than 100 million copies printed. She was commissioned by all the famous tune writers of her day to write texts for them, as many as three a week, and many under pseudonyms. In her lifetime, she used 200 different pseudonyms. This particular song was written as she meditated on the goodness of God after receiving an unexpected good fortune". (Hymn Notes for Church Bulletins by Austin C. Lovelace)


