Tips for Conflict Resolution...

In 70-80 percent of congregations, a situation that flows mid-stream can prevent the membership from growing. That situation is called un-resolved

conflict. Conflict happens when two or more people work together, live together, play together, or attend church activities together. When the conflict is un-resolved, it becomes a cancer that will eat away at relationships and end up destroying otherwise great and wonderful relationships. Here are some helpful tips if you are ever involved in conflict that seems unable to be resolved.

- 1. CONFRONT THE INDIVIDUAL OR GROUP WITH WHOM YOUR ARE HAVING CONFLICT. Talking to others and sharing with them your feelings about the situation which causes your conflict, many times is all it takes to resolving misunderstandings. When speaking, it is always helpful to use "I" terms. Try to say something like; When you do that or say that, "I" feel...
- 2. SEEK TO UNDERSTAND YOUR ROLE IN THE CONFLICT. The old saying, "it takes two to tango" makes sense in unresolved conflict. When one understands their own contribution in creating the conflict, self-healing can begin. No one can change you unless you allow the power from others to do so. We can control our own thinking, speaking, feeling, and actions.
- 3. PUT YOURSELF IN THE OTHER PERSON OR GROUP'S POSITION. How do others see you? In other words, if you were on the other side of the situation, how would you see yourself? This will enable one to realize that there is more than one answer or way to resolve the situation.

4. PRAY FOR THE GROUP OR PERSON THAT YOU ARE IN CONFLICT WITH. This is probably the most important tip I can think of that will help resolve conflict. I am not saying pray for the situation, but pray for the individual or group you are in conflict with, listing in your prayers each name. It is difficult to be in conflict with someone when you pray for them by name. In our serious praying, we find ourselves at the foot of the Cross realizing once more about our sinfulness, forgiveness, love, and compassion. When we are reminded about our relationship with God through Christ, we are better able to show those same attributes to others, especially those we might be in conflict with.

I hope this helps all who read this the next time you find yourself in a situation that creates conflict. One last word... don't allow this cancerous disease to infect the body of Christ. When all of God's children work together to overcome conflict, the disease is destroyed.
