## Your Regional Elder

In case you have been wondering why you have a Regional Elder, here is a partial explanation. I am a volunteer with our Region. Every Cluster of churches in the Christian Church in Illinois and Wisconsin has a Regional Elder. Our Cluster is composed of the Disciples churches of Albion, Barney's Prairie, Lawrenceville, Mt. Carmel, Olney, and Robinson.

The Cluster ministers, both active and retired, meet for prayer and discussion on the second Monday of every month, September through May, and I attend those meetings. The Regional Elders meet in Bloomington every February and August with the Regional Ministers for training and study. I attend those meetings when the weather permits.

As a Regional Elder, I am a communication link between our six congregations and ministers, and the Region. I am supposed to be a local source of help and information. Sometimes it feels like we here in the southern part of the state are not important to the Region, but we ARE! In fact, WE are the Region, and the Regional staff is there only to help us.

I visit worship occasionally in the congregation, or attend a board meeting or some celebration. I maintain contact with the ministers and am supportive of them and their ministries

"Those were the days, my friend, we thought they'd never end..." Time and space have blessed me with the ability to not remember who, when and where these lyrics were important to me. They are 'falling leaves' and just remind me of human life which begins with birth, fresh and new, like spring. Summer follows and much is accomplished; graduations, families, grandchildren, more graduations, new homes; in short, growth! Then, the fall of life arrives and is characterized by empty nests, downsizing, and needing care givers. Some call this the circle of life.

The Fall Season, full of cooler weather, changing and falling leaves, and less critter sounds, calls me to reflect upon God's wonderful world. He's in the process of showing us earth's bare bones, naked, as our kids used to call bare trees. Great sadness spreads over me when I see how "we" (humanity) has trashed and polluted God's wondrous earth! Then I wonder, have we as His children, polluted ourselves?

God gave humans the responsibility (dominion) over the earth, told us to be fruitful and care for her. Check it out in

Genesis, Chapter 1. Down through the generations, our families have had fall clean-up days, inside and outside of our portion of the earth. Each Fall Season becomes our time to clean up, repair, exchange lighter clothing for warmer wear, bring in the sheaves (crops), and store up for winter. Oddly enough, old habits die hard, especially the good ones.

Have our past generations passed on to us the "need" to clean, repair, and put right our lives with Christ, too? Do we need a spiritual fall cleanup? Personally, I am constantly cleaning out, putting away childish things, correcting, repenting and repairing my relationship with my Heavenly Father. Take inventory of your space within. Do you have leaves to rake (unresolved issues), fences to repair (broken relationships), windows to wash (spiritual cleanup), and a change of weather gear (confess and repent = new holy robes)?

Even though autumn leaves are falling and cooler days are coming our way, we cannot relax. Continued diligence must be kept in the care of 1) our souls, our life with God in Christ, 2) our relationships, both within our families and with those whom God sends our ways, and 3) constant maintenance, physically, emotionally, and especially spiritually. Indeed, fall cleanup is necessary for our care of Mother earth, and especially for the health of our relationship with God.
