Ordinary Time

We believe in God as our Holy Father, in Jesus as our Savior and Lord, and in the Holy Spirit as our Comforter and Guide. Therefore, we are called the children of God and gather with others of God's family in First Christian Church (DOC). All of God's children need spiritual mentoring and guidance. Dietrich Bonhoeffer shares his thoughts/notes in his book, *I Want to Live These Days with You*, daily exercise in faith.

"Why is it that my thoughts wander so quickly from God's word, and that in my hour of need, the needed word is often not there? Do I ever forget to eat and drink and sleep? Then why do I forget God's word? Because I still can't say what the psalmist says: 'I will delight in your statues' (Ps. 119:16). I don't forget the things in which I take delight. Forgetting or not forgetting is a matter of not the mind but the whole person, of the heart. I never forget what body and soul depend upon. The more I begin to love the commandments of God in creation and word, the more present they will be for me in every hour. Only love protects against forgetting.

Because God's word has spoken to us in history and thus in the past, the remembering and repetition of what we have learned is a necessary daily exercise. Every day we must turn to God's acts of salvation, so that we can again move forward...Faith and obedience live on in remembrance and repetition. Remembrance becomes the power of the present because of the living God who once acted for me and who reminds me of that today." (Emphasis is mine)

As children of God, we are called to pay attention as we love God and one another. Many Disciples of Christ Churches make use of Liturgical Paraments as a reminder of who we are and to whom we belong, and as outward, visible signs to signify the seasons and worship practices of the church during the year. Our white Paraments, representing purity, holiness, virtue and respect, were on display during Christmas and Christmastide (also known as the 12 days of Christmas) and ended with Epiphany on January 6, 2020.

Currently, we are in Ordinary time and use the green Paraments representing hope, life and anticipation. This color marks the space between high Holy Days. The Paraments will stay green until Ash Wednesday.

Ash Wednesday signals the beginning of Lent, April 9th through May 9th. The Lenten color is purple or violet and emphasizes a time of fasting, faith, patience and trust.

Maundy Thursday marks the end of Lent and the Paraments return to white again signaling Holy Days. The only exception is Black Friday/Good Friday when black is draped over the cross to identify death and Jesus' time in the grave. The altar cloths stay white until Pentecost Sunday, which punctuates our church year and the Paraments are changed to red, representing the blood, fire, and passion of Christ.

Ordinary time of hope, life, and anticipation signified by the green Paraments, returns the very next Sunday. These will remain until after Thanksgiving when Advent 2020 begins (6/1 – 11/28/2020). Our liturgical year will come full circle and we will display the white Paraments from 11/29 to 1/5/2021.


BAPTISM SERVICE...February 9


